Whether it be from an Animal Control Officer or a good Samaritan, it is an occurrence that we have become accustomed to handling. While each animal's individual circumstances are different, their need for help is all the same. The York County SPCA has spent thousands of dollars and countless man hours to attend to the medical needs of these animals. Waldo is a domestic longhaired brown tabby found in Manchester Township. Upon arrival at the shelter, it was discovered that he has a BB lodged in his head. The SPCA has performed surgery on Waldo to remove the pellet and he is expected to make a full recovery.

Thunder came to the SPCA as a stray on 5-13-08. She is a mixed shepherd approximately 5 years old. When she arrived at the SPCA she



was thin, had overgrown toenails and was suffering from an unknown skin condition. The SPCA was able to speak with the previous owners of the dog, who signed over custody of Thunder so she could receive needed medical attention. Thunder is

currently under the care of a veterinarian through the SPCA and is undergoing treatment to cure her skin ailment. Thunder is a SPCA staff favorite.

Brewster is a domestic shorthaired red tabby found in York City. He was discovered with an abscess on his front leg which caused swelling and discomfort resulting in Brewster not using his leg. The SPCA has attended to the wound and is providing supportive care.



Emmy is a mixed collie found in Dover Township. She had been hit by a car and was suffering from a broken leg. The injury has been repaired and is healing. Emmy recuperated in a volunteer foster home many weeks before she could be adopted.
