Blue, a 5-month-old Siberian Husky, made his debut recently at Bark in the Park at PeoplesBank Stadium. Boomer will officially retire at the end of the 2019 baseball season.

“Of course, no dog can replace Boomer, but (Blue) is ready to step in to carry on the legacy Boomer has forged over 10 seasons,” Revolution General Manager John Gibson said in a news release.

He said that Blue will be the furry community ambassador for the team and the namesake of the Revolution's youth reading program, which will be renamed Blue's Book Club.
